
New Member Update





New membership applications are continuing at a reasonably steady rate. As at the end of October 175 new members have joined since 1-1-11. Monthly New Member Chart below.






















NZ SuperKart Champs & CIK Trophy of NZ

Rule Changes Issue 2011-11 has been published recently. To view click **HERE**

This Issue includes:

- Clarifications regarding Drivers Briefing, sealing/marking of components and Time Trials.
- Revised Event Permit rules. These are stage one of the revisions discussed at Conference to help address event calendar issues. Further changes will be the subject of Rule Proposals in the next Rules Round.
- Introduction of a Change of Guardian Form (which can be dowloaded <u>HERE</u>) for times when a legal guardian/parent is not present during competition. Forms will also be available from Club Race Secretaries.
- Following a trial period over the past 12 months, confirmation of Junior Clubsport 120 as a Non Championship Club Day only class.
- Starting procedure exception for ClubSport 120 competitors.

- All karts will run with Black Numbers on Yellow Plates as of 1-1-12.
- If you are purchasing a new race suit make sure it complies with Rule G3.2 "new rule applicable 1-1-12." KartSport New Zealand is pleased to report that <u>JPC Motorsport</u>, Christchurch (phone 03-383 3353) has been issued with the first KartSport New Zealand Approval Code Label issued under Rule G3.2 Option 2 for locally made race suits.

Tech Talk

with John Lennox, National Technical Officer

The Rotax coil part # 265571 with 'extension wire' as pictured below has been withdrawn from competition by BRP Rotax from 01-01-12.



Right Karts has not supplied any of the these coils either with an engine or as a spare part. Right Karts made the decision to refuse to allow these coils to enter the NZ market and therefore there have been none officially supplied in NZ. It is therefore highly unlikely that any of these coils are in NZ however as none have been supplied officially, they are not valid for use in KartSport New Zealand competition.
