Marked tyres will be distributed by the Tech Department to a timetable, on a class by class basis, on Thursday 17th April. Providing the track is not wet, the testing timetable will allow you the opportunity to run in your race tyres on Thursday afternoon, should you wish to.

Clarification of Rule K3.9, Final Drive Cadet Raket and Cadet ROK - Drive and Axle Sprockets

Drive and Axle Sprockets: The correct number of teeth for the sprocket size must be present and uniform, allowing for normal wear and tear. The absence or removal of teeth from either sprocket will be deemed a breach of the rule and normal penalty(s) will apply.

Incapacity as a Result of Illness or Accident.

Each time you enter an event you sign a declaration stating that you don't have a medical condition that may impede your ability to drive a kart in competition or practice.

Medical conditions can range from bruising, to a broken leg or a bad dose of the flu or worse.

As a karter you are required to be aware of your responsibilities in this area of our sport.

Check out Section F of the 2014 KartSport Manual, F1.5 discusses action you or your parent/guardian need to take if you are suffering an illness or involved in any accident, it does not have to be a karting injury accident.

Contact Robert Hutton G1.3 requires you to report a medical condition prior to any competition, eg. at a club day to the First Aid personnel on duty.

Rules G1.12 and G1.13 again describe action you are required to take if you are involved in an injury accident.
